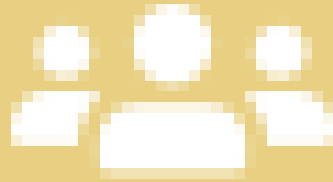

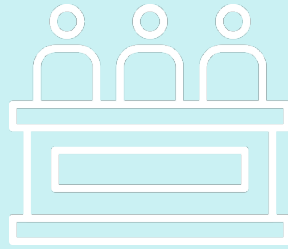

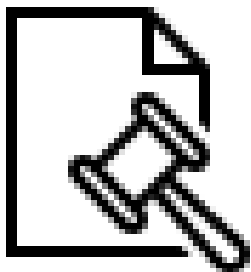

BROADWAY WALK OF FAME POLICY

I. Purpose

The “Broadway Walk of Fame” will provide a unique attraction that enhances and encourages a walkable downtown. Each star will honor local Seaside residents and serve as a living historical record of our achievements as a community.

The ultimate goal is to honor those individuals who have made a significant and lasting contribution to the quality of life in Seaside – who have, indeed, cast a long shadow on our City’s history.

This program will align with the Parks, Recreational Facility, City owned building, and street naming policy as appropriate.

II. Eligibility Criteria

A. Broadway Walk of Fame Nominees must meet one of the following categories (no more than one category may be selected):

1. Athletics and Competition
2. Arts and Performing Media
3. Civics and Government
4. Community and Social Equality
5. Education
6. Environment and Conservation
7. Journalism and Literature
8. Outstanding Achievement

B. Broadway Walk of Fame Nominees must have made a consistent and positive impact in three or more of the areas listed below:

1. A minimum of three years’ residency in the City of Seaside and or has made a significant positive impact on Seaside.
2. Ability to inspire and encourage others to enhance diversity and inclusion in the City of Seaside.
3. Bringing positive recognition to the City on a local, national, or global stage.
4. Contributing a significant historical impact.
5. Contributing to the health and safety of our citizens.
6. Contributing to the quality of life of our citizens
7. Expanding opportunities for the City of Seaside to become a destination of choice.
8. Extraordinary effort to overcome challenges to achieve contribution.
9. Fostering the spirit of our community.



10. Making lasting and significant contributions to the protection of natural or cultural resources of the City of Seaside.
11. Making substantial contributions to the advancement of commensurate types of recreational opportunities with the City of Seaside.
12. Making substantial contributions to the betterment of a specific facility or park consistent with the established standards for the facility.
13. Providing economic development or redevelopment activity.
14. Providing positive opportunities for the future of our youth.
15. Volunteering or working in the community for five (5) or more years.

III. Broadway Walk of Fame Committee

- A. The purpose of the Committee is twofold:
 1. The Committee is an ad hoc committee to the Council to make recommendations on the design of the star and to assist staff regarding placement recommendations on Broadway for the first cycle of the program.
 2. The Committee will be responsible for reviewing applications and making nominee inductee recommendations to Council.
- B. The Broadway Walk of Fame Committee will consist of a combination of commissioners made up of C-Jobs, Art & History, and Seaside Residents. A maximum of two members from each commission and a maximum of three Seaside residents to be selected by the Mayor. There will be a minimum of 5 members with a maximum of 7 members total.

IV. Application Process

Nominees will be inducted into the Broadway Walk of Fame program on an annual basis. Applications deemed incomplete will be rejected. Nominees not selected for the installation can reapply the following year for consideration.

- A. In March of each calendar year, the City's Broadway Walk of Fame program will open the application period for nominations for the Walk of Fame. Applications will be accepted for a 30 calendar days.
- B. All complete applications received will be forwarded to the Committee for review and consideration.
- C. The Committee will review all applications and meet with applicants as needed to make a final recommendation to the Council at their next regularly scheduled meeting.
- D. The applicant shall be able to provide clear evidence that the individual to be honored has made a significant contribution to the Seaside community based on the eligibility criteria.
- E. A maximum of six inductees will be added to the Walk of Fame on an annual basis.
- F. All nominations will be given the same consideration without regard to the nomination source. Applications that do not meet the criteria set forth in this policy will be denied.



- G. The names of individuals or corporations or groups involved in controversial enterprises or activities, such as those that would be detrimental to the mission or image of the City of Seaside will be avoided, and the application will be denied.
- H. A denial letter will be sent to the applicant detailing the reason(s) for denial. Applicants are eligible to re-apply in the following year if the criteria for their original application has been met.

V. Fees

- A. The applicant or group will be responsible for the fees associated with the purchase of the star and all installation costs.
- B. The City Council may waive the fees associated with the purchase and / or installation costs at their direction and may elect to establish an annual budget for this program.

VI. Recognition Ceremony

- A. Inductees will be recognized in a public ceremony, proclamation, and honored with a star on the "Broadway Walk of Fame" in downtown Seaside.

VII. City Council Review Process:

- A. The Council will determine star placement on Broadway, hearing recommendations from staff. Placement will be done in phases, with consideration for the walkability and enhancement of downtown.
- B. The City Council shall have the final authority to name and rename the commemorative star.
- C. Under extraordinary circumstances that would cast a negative image upon the City, any star naming in honor of an individual, family or group may be revoked at the discretion of the City Council.
- D. The Council has the authority to modify this program as needed in order to meet the policy objectives.
- E. The City Manager or designee will manage the Broadway Walk of Fame program and support the Committee in its assigned duties.

MISSION STATEMENT:

To advise the City of Seaside in the advancement, preservation and protection of Historical and Cultural heritage so that this and future generations may know and appreciate the historical resources, places, people, events and the arts which represent the City of Seaside.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

The Seaside Art Commission was created by Ordinance 70, on May 17, 1956, two years after the City of Seaside was incorporated.

The Seaside History Commission was established by the adoption of Ordinance 593 on October 15, 1981.

These two Commissions were combined to form the Seaside Art & History Commission in 2010 by ordinance number 986.

According to the City ordinance, "The Art and History Commission shall have the power, and it shall be the duty of the commission to make recommendations to the City Council and to advise the council in the following matters:

- A. Pertaining to the encouragement of the arts, crafts and historical activities;
- B. Pertaining to the promotion of programs of artistic merit within the city;
- C. Pertaining to the collection, promotion, display and preservation of Seaside's historical artifacts;
- D. Designate, protect, preserve, enhance and perpetuate those structures and areas of historical, architectural and engineering significance;
- E. Encourage the city systematic collection and preservation of Seaside's historic records and manuscripts. (Ord. 986 § 3, 2010)"
