**SUBJECT: PRESENTATION ON AB413 AND SEASIDE POLICE
DEPARTMENT'S DAYLIGHTING PROJECT TO INCREASE
PEDESTRIAN VISIBILITY AT CROSSWALKS**

PURPOSE & RECOMMENDATION

The purpose of this item is to receive a presentation and obtain feedback on AB413 and the Police Department's Daylighting Intersection Demonstration Project at selected intersections.

BACKGROUND

The Daylighting Bill, AB 413, mandates that vehicles must not stop, stand, or park within 20 feet of any marked or unmarked crosswalk. For crosswalks with curb extensions, a 15-foot buffer is required. This safety measure increases visibility for approaching drivers and those already stopped in traffic, offering them a better view of pedestrians entering the crosswalk. AB 413 recommends the issuance of warning notices to first-time offenders until January 1, 2025, after which citations will be issued.

The Police Department will be presenting a daylighting demonstration project and their efforts to improve visibility to create safer streets in Seaside.

Daylighting Seaside Project ☀️



Daylighting Law is effective 1/1/25 for enforcement. 22500 (n)(1)(A) CVC. (prohibits) Parking within 20 feet of the vehicle approach side of any marked or unmarked crosswalk or within 15 feet of any crosswalk where a curb extension is present.

As a shift project, Parking Compliance Specialists Iris Klotz & Frances deLeon, Vehicle Abatement Officer Miguel Montes and Animal Control Specialist Alex Kjellgren are teaming up to create safer streets in Seaside and take action with the fast approaching state daylighting law per AB413.

They would like to roll their sleeves up and help with identifying dangerous intersections to improve visibility, painting the red and yellow curbs and setting Flex Post delineators. They have reached out to Public Works, who will provide the supplies and some staffing. They have also reached out to Seaside Fire Department for staff support. They wanted to educate the public versus assuming the public would stay up to date on every state regulation.

Below is a list of priority intersections. These intersections will not interfere with the City's traffic calming project.

Next intersections to address:

1. San Lucas/Palm – 1 injury accident in '22 + resident complaint
2. Noche Buena/Military – high school (School Zone)
3. Olympia/Terrace – 2 injury accidents since '23
4. San Pablo/Noche Buena – 6 injury accidents since '20, paint red 15ft from bump outs

5. San Pablo/Flores – 3 injury accidents since '21
6. Noche Buena/La Salle – 3 injury accidents since '19, paint red 15ft from bump outs
7. Olympia/Winton – 3 injury accidents since '22
8. Noche Buena/Ord Grove – 2 injury accidents since '22, near high school
9. San Pablo/Mescal (School Zone)
10. Yosemite/Westminster (School Zone)

The crew have tentatively scheduled October 9, 2024 at 1000 hours, for a planned painting/stripping event.
