RECOMMENDATION: Commissioners will contemplate engaging with the Seaside Neighborhood Improvement Commission in a dual, collaborative meeting to explore building a partnership to work together in the future in service of the needs of Seaside's most vulnerable community members.

Commissioner will also choose a representative to attend the Lead Me Home Summit on Homelessness taking place on April 17, 2025.
