**SUBJECT: CONDUCT A STUDY SESSION ON THE FISCAL YEAR 2025/2026
WORK-PLAN**

RECOMMENDATION

Select projects or programs to recommend to the City Council for the Fiscal Year 2025/2026 work plan.

BACKGROUND

The Neighborhood Improvement Commission (NIC) is entrusted with and holds the duty of making recommendations to the City Council and advising the Council on matters pertaining to general improvement of the neighborhoods within the City. The main way this is achieved is through the commission's annual work-plan.

The NIC is allocated funding through the City's Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT), and with the allocated funding the commission is tasked with selecting projects that meet the criteria set forth in Chapter 2.24 of the City's Municipal Code. Those projects will be recommended to the City Council for approval. The estimated allocation for fiscal year 2025/2026 is between \$300,000 - \$400,000. In fiscal year 2024/2025, the commission was allocated \$398,000.

Some of the past projects are:

Oldemeyer Center Mural
Resurfacing of the Wheeler Street tennis courts and adding 4 pickleball courts
Benches on General Jim Moore road
Utility Box Art
Lights for Palm Trees on Fremont
Residential Tree Giveaway program

Each year the commission solicits input from other commissions and community groups for ideas,

and during their study session they will identify projects to move forward with and get more detailed information, including potential costs.

The NIC has received proposals from the following groups: Parks & Recreation Commission, Art * History Commission, Homeless Commission, Friends of Seaside Parks Association, Sustainable Seaside, Seaside Public Works, and a community member.

NIC Request 1 - Private Citizen

Lynda cunningham – I'm a member of the Seaside Homeless Committee but I am sending these ideas as a private citizen.

At the Oldemeyer Center fund a "high tech" space for kids who are interested in STEM. We fund sports areas for kids to do sports, lets fund an area for kids who enjoy science, tech, engineering & math.
How about an Arts space for kids into that too?

Funding an App for letting Seaside's know what events are going on. There was discussion of a sign but only people driving by that would see it. I don't know what can be done. Maybe it is going old school and mailing flyers or a post card letting people know what is happening and where to find more information.

Pump Bike Park like the one in Marina.

I think Seaside has several places it can create pump bike parks. Parents from all over bring their kids to Marina to ride their bikes here.

They could be dirt "off road" trails with "hills" – I had this where I grew up in Phoenix – the kids called it: the hills

Look at that hillside north of the Highschool

There is so much potential to attract people to an outdoor adventure park in that area.

At Metz Park there is the area behind the baseball fence that could have an "off road" hilly bike path/loop. In the south-east corner there could be a hilly loop for small kids.

There are other schools around town with large areas that could have "hilly" bike paths made so kids have fun safe places to ride their bikes.

Add to the platforms for the benches on General Jim Moore so a wheelchair can safely sit next to the bench.

More stop sign reflectors – if the police find they are helping.

On Fremont it appears many street signs need replaced: Broadway missing at Fremont, Ord Grove at Fremont – many along Fremont.

Nature friendly lights on the Lagoon & Roberts lake – show them off at night – but only if it doesn't interfere with the animals, birds and bats....

A nice ADA ramp by Seaside High School at Monterey & North Fremont. This area is bad for all students and a nice wide ramp with a big Seaside side built into it. This could be a real show piece.

Maybe NIC could add money to make this a real statement piece

Plant a cypress tree or two knowing over the decades they will grow large

Best time to plant a tree? Twenty years ago. Second best time? Now!

Make a real path along North Fremont from Military to the High School.

Fix the north roundabout in the Automall. The wall is broken and has been for over a year.

Reflectors on the islands like they have in Monterey. They have added yellow & black striped reflectors on the curbs on islands. I have seen people drive over the curbs while making left turns. I couldn't find the reflectors like Monterey has but this is similar.

Reflective Traffic Light Backplates. They have these along Hwy 68. They make the traffic lights more visible.



So many homes in Seaside do not have house numbers on them, they are hard to see, they were painted over... While delivering flowers for Valentines Day many times I think: a person would die while the ambulance tries to find this home. NIC could pay to have street numbers painted on the curb for all the homes with curbs.

I read Sand City sent a letter to Seaside asking Seaside to work with them on a linear park, which I assume is along the railroad tracks. This too could be a real show case for Seaside and a benefit to all Seaside residents.

Paint murals on the AT&T building on Broadway. The design of the building makes for several panels that can have a continuous story or different artists on each panel.

- The building looks "bad", it needs repainted.
- The fencing is "ghetto". Please ask them to upgrade it.
- NIC could offer a \$500 "grant" towards these improvement projects.

Huge mural on the back of the Sealamp Inn motel at 2201 Del Monte Blvd. The visibility from highway is: PRICELESS!
It Could be in the style of huge wide SEASIDE letters with images of Seaside "in" the letters.

- The Golf course, the beach with kites, Blues in the Park, the National Monument, CSUMB....

It could be a huge post-card with an image of the fabulous view from the top of Seaside.

Put this out to bid – there is so much potential

Add lighting to the Cypress Tress at Laguna Grande Park – where there is power to do so.

Clean up the cypress trees along the west-side of General Jim Moore near Coe. This will be the “gateway” to the 5 star hotel at the golf courses – let make it beautiful!

Convert all the lighting along General Jim Moore to Dark Skies friendly lighting. Dark Skies tourism is a thing and it’s growing. Seaside can be a leader keeping Monterey Bay Dark.

The VA along the highway in Marina has dark skies friendly lighting. It makes seeing easier and safer. Having a dark area at the top of Seaside can be a benefit to Seaside businesses.
Much of the dark skies friendly lighting is just making sure lights point down.

Along Fremont north of the Sealamp Inn on the west side are exposed pipes that might be gas lines (?). I fear someone could drive into them and cause an explosion. Some kind of planter or Art piece could be put there to protect those pipes.

There are many dead trees around Seaside. It is very expensive to have trees removed. These dead trees are hazards from fire and falling in storms. Along the lines of Hight Five which helps people clean up front yards. There could be a program to grant \$1,000 toward dead tree removal. One grant per household, with a total annual funding of \$10,000 (help 10 households).

The mural inside at Oldemeyer Center is lovely but feels unfinished. The two light “colored” panels on the sides, it floats off the floor, I can’t put my finger on it but if some money could go to something to “finish” it. Make a frame around it? Paint the panels on the sides darker color? Have murals painted so it looks like pillars, or larger potted plants. Let’s make this mural even better. NIC could

ask Monterey Tile on Fremont to design a way to show off & finish this mural – maybe with stone “bricks” which could show off what can be done with their products.

A small plaque thanking their business for “donating” the materials & install could be hung ☐

More wraps on electric boxes.

More murals everywhere.

Fund drone programs at all the Seaside schools. The Monterey area is hot bed of drone technology. Getting our kids interested in drones is great for the kids, great for the local economy as we prepare these kids for the jobs in our local community.

Big ideas:

Linear Park across the top of Seaside west of General Jim Moore.

Make a real, safe, ground path

Zip lines – this could be a business

A raised path with the best views on Monterey Bay or large decks off the west side of the sidewalk along Gen Moore.

There could be a deck all long Gen Moore that is fairly level with the land dropping away like the Redwood Sky Walk in Eureka CA

Off road bike trails

Animal & human bridge over General Jim Moore. This would make driving safer for people & crossing safer for animals.

This would be an attraction that brings visitors to Seaside for the Best Views of the Bay

Light Show Cover over Broadway downtown - a ‘modern’ version of what is in Las Vegas.

Botanical Garden?

Sculpture Garden?

A Joby Air electric taxi stand in Seaside. We should be supporting this local business and ensuring Seaside has a place where people can "catch" a ride.

Seaside owns the small lot on the north-west corner of Del Monte & Playa, just south of Lavender Brothers.

Can this area be made pretty?

Can this be made into a car charging space for visitors to Seaside? Not everyone wants or needs a high-speed expensive Tesla charger.

Can this area be sold to Lavender Brothers since they use it to park cars on?

Large (2.5 to 3 feet tall) cement planters along Canyon Del Rey to protect City Hall lawn from cars that might run people over when we are having events or just to destroy the lawn "for fun".

We saw planters like these in Washington DC where sidewalks had lovely flower planters along the sidewalks, street side, to protect the people on the sidewalks and the Gov't buildings plus they were very pretty. Of course, there would need to be on going funding to maintain the planters

Drone show for 4th of July. Maybe at the Golf Course.

NIC Request 2 – Private Citizen

Lynda Cunningham Homeless Committee here as a private citizen.

The fire hydrant in front of my home (2026 Waring St) needs painted. It looks neglected un-cared for. I bet all the fire hydrants in Seaside could use a fresh coat of paint too.

The hydrant used to be silver when we moved in, it was later painted yellow. It is now faded and has rust marks all over....

The red fire lane paint has faded too. The freshly painted no parking curbs at crosswalks looks so nice.

That is 2 ideas – fresh paint for hydrants & curbs.

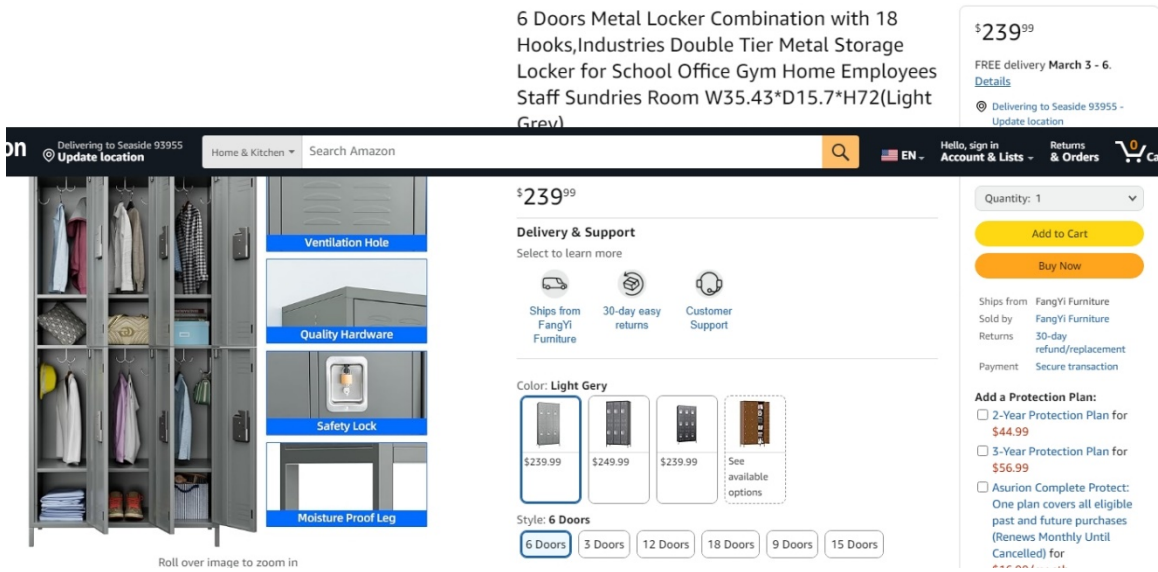

#1 Playground equipment - Mescal Neil Park

In the 1970's, Mescal Neil Park served as a center for community life with lots of green grass, tall trees, 2 separate swing sets, 4 picnic tables under a pergola, and 2 barbeques.

After the water was shut off in 2006, the park fell into serious decline. The grass, trees, picnic tables, barbeques, and the pergola all disappeared. The park became lifeless.

With the intervention of FOSPA in the last few years, a new pollinator habitat has been created on the West side and neighbors have created a succulent garden on the East side.

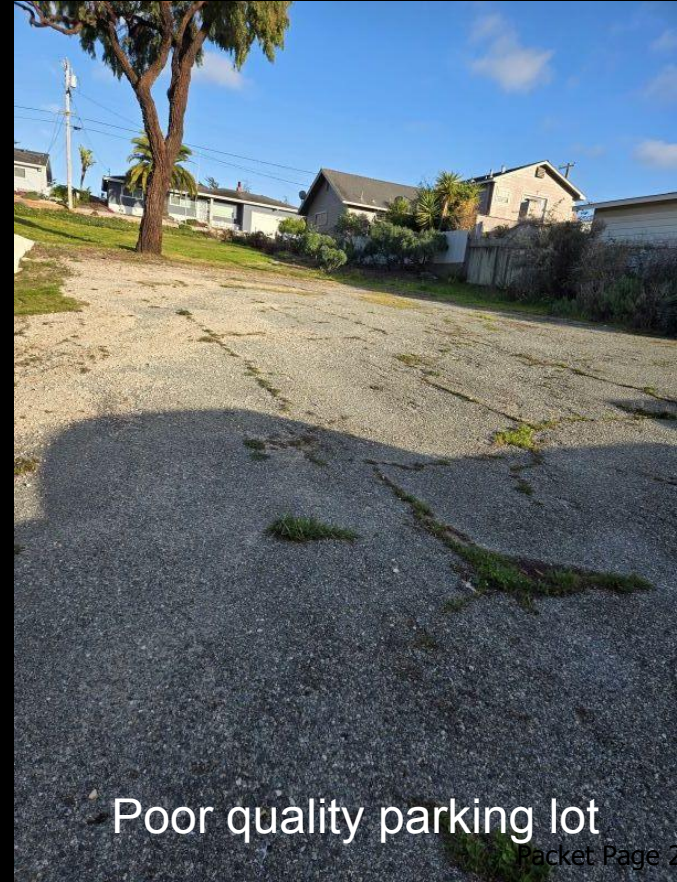
#2 ADA Parking & Accessibility for Capra Park

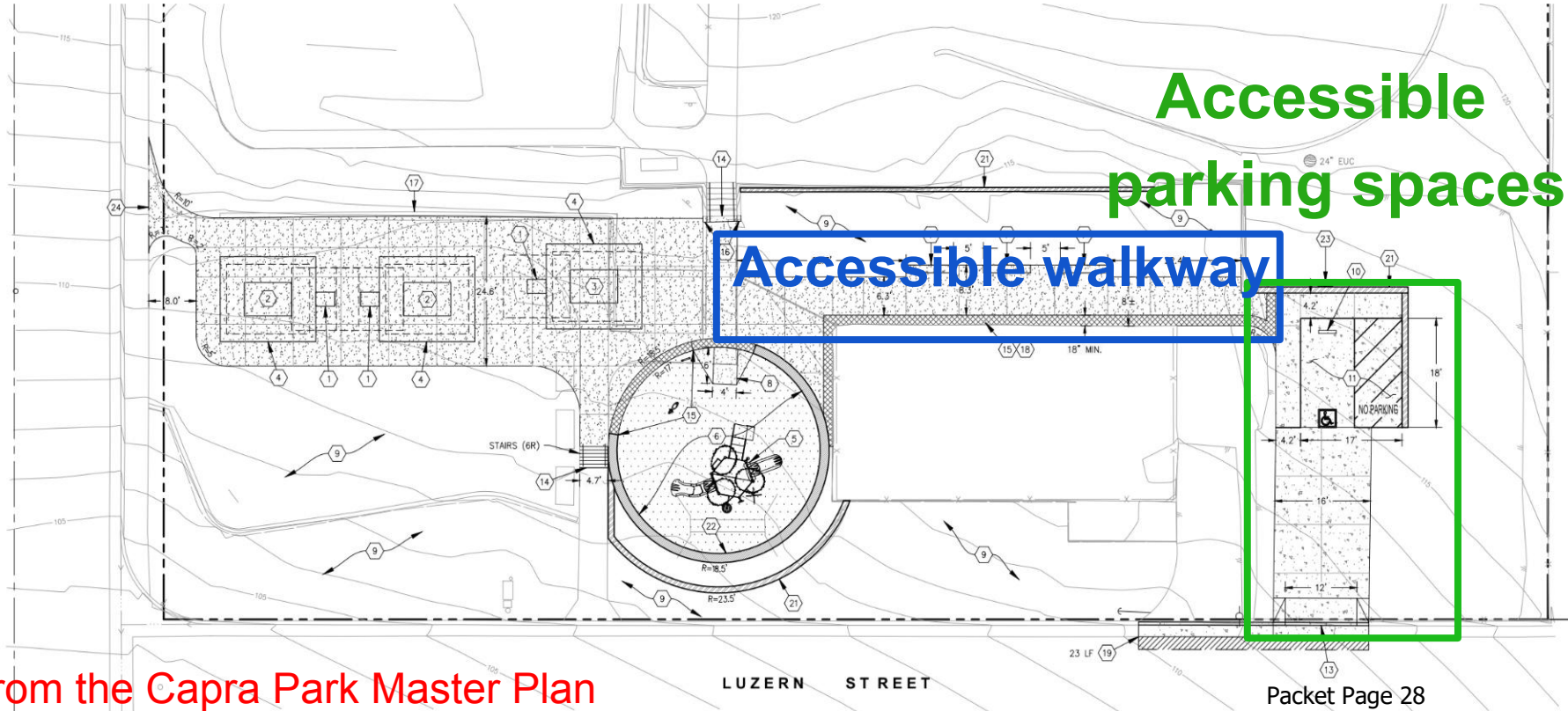

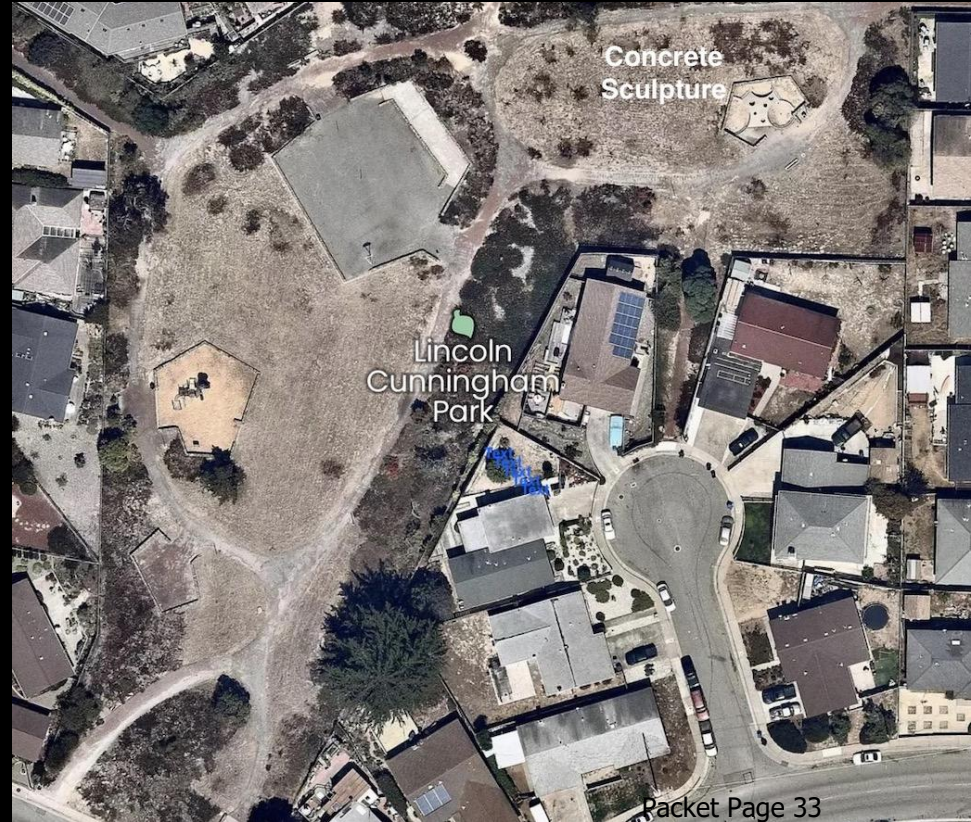

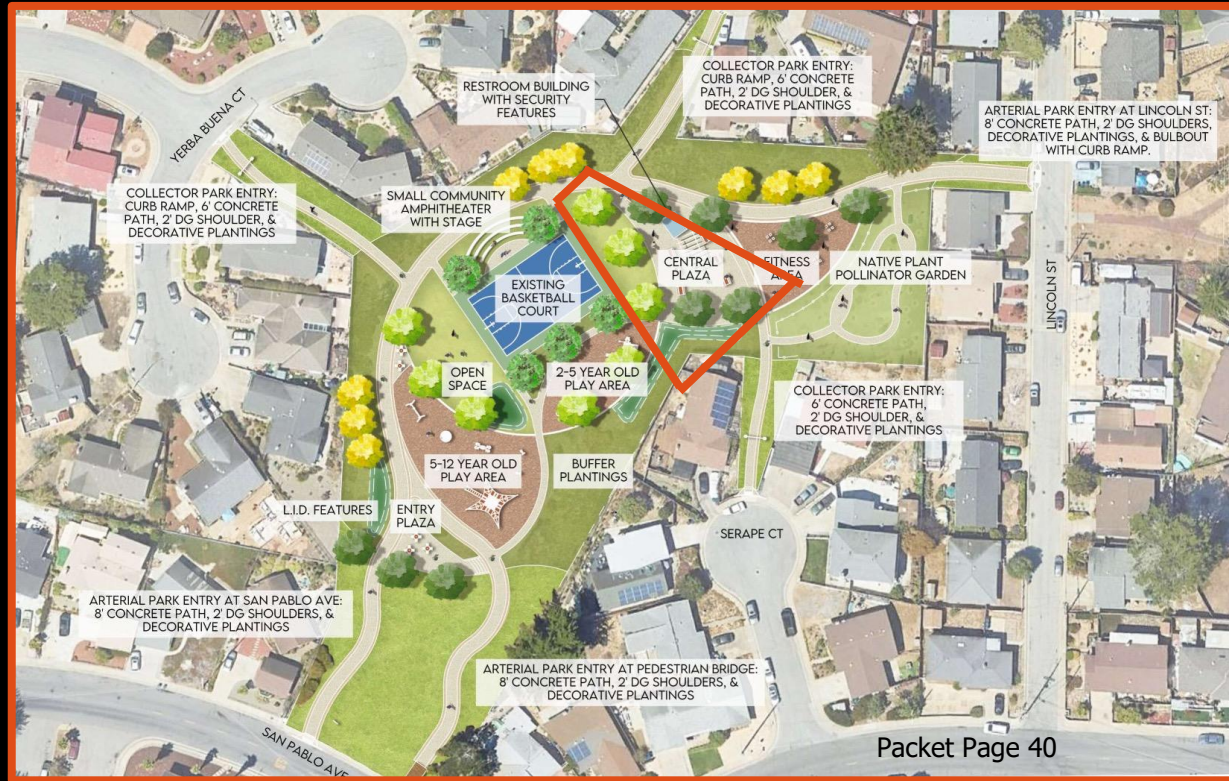

NIC Request 5 – Parks and Recreation

The attached proposals outline critical projects that blend tangible infrastructure improvements with broader community-building initiatives, ensuring both immediate and long-term benefits for residents. Below is a summary of each request, supported by proven successes in neighboring cities:

1. Bike Racks & Connectivity Enhancements

Installing bike racks at parks, trails, and community hubs encourages eco-friendly transportation and promotes health. For example, local and state data saw a 40% increase in park usage after installing racks, reducing traffic congestion and fostering connectivity between neighborhoods.

2. Adult Recreation Equipment

Outdoor fitness stations (e.g., resistance bands, pull-up bars) cater to adults seeking accessible wellness opportunities. Local cities have reported a 25% rise in senior engagement post-installation, improving mental and physical health outcomes.

3. Sensor-Activated Lighting for Parks

Energy-efficient, motion-sensor lighting enhances safety while reducing costs and light pollution. Local and state data documented a 30% decrease in after-hours incidents following similar upgrades, creating safer spaces for evening activities.

4. Track & Field Program Expansion

A structured program for youth and adults promotes fitness, discipline, and teamwork. Local city track programs became a regional draw, hosting tournaments that boosted local tourism and community pride.

5. PAL Basketball Program Partnership

Collaborating with Police Athletic Leagues builds trust between law enforcement and youth while reducing idle time. Local cities saw juvenile delinquency rates drop by 18% within two years of launching their PAL initiative.

6. Community Tree Giveaway Initiative

Distributing native saplings combats urban heat islands and engages residents in sustainability. State data showed it increased its tree canopy by 12% in three years, improving air quality and neighborhood aesthetics.

7. ADA-Compliant Water Fountains

Modern hydration stations ensure accessibility for all visitors. Our parks statewide noted a 20% increase in park usage by seniors and families after installing similar fixtures, aligning with equity and public health goals.

These projects are not just “brick-and-mortar” upgrades; they represent investments in social cohesion, environmental resilience, and equitable access. Like other municipalities, we can create spaces that serve as both physical anchors and catalysts for community pride, health, and safety.
