Commissioner Strickland: Came across a flier that informs the community that MPUSD has a social emotions support staff member who assist student who are facing homelessness. Would like to invite someone from MPUSD to speak to the commission about the services they have. Received mail from Navy Federal/Operation Hope who offer financial literacy. Came across information on Vehicles for Veterans a resource for homeless veterans needing a vehicle. Would like a Seaside High Student or a local University Psychology major to join the commission for them to gain knowledge and increase engagement. Mayor Pro Tem Dave Pacheco invited the commission to a town hall meeting with him and Councilman Alex Miller on Monday, April 7th at 6:00 PM at the Embassy Suites, with the City Manager and Danny Bakewell Jr. to be present.

BACKGROUND

FISCAL IMPACT

It has been communicated to the Seaside Homeless Commission that a total of \$7,000 would be considered to fund a solar-powered device charging station and \$2,000 would be considered to fund 12 outdoor lockers for community use. These amounts are pending approval of the Seaside Homeless Commission's proposal to the Seaside Neighborhood Improvement Commission and City Council.

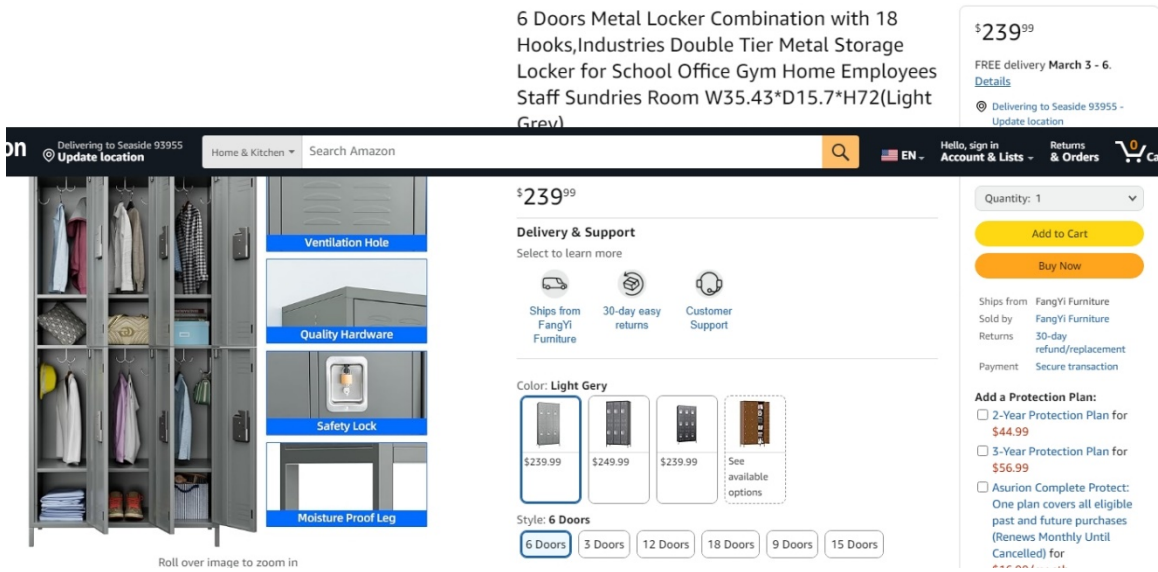

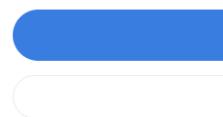
