3. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

* Chey Diehl reported that she is working on getting art for an open house in January at the Monterey Peace & Justice Center. The theme is MLK or to fit the theme of the center. Chey asked if the Commissioners would help her find people with art for the open house.

5. BUSINESS ITEMS:

a. Seaside/CSUMB Oral History Project:

**** Information on upcoming series:**

- * Commissioner Wildgoose handed out a list of possible Oral History Interviewees for the next series (Jan 2019 – Apr 2019). Commissioners reviewed and discussed who was on the list.
- * Commissioner Russell suggested that they invite all the interviewees together and have a group of service learners to do interviews. This would give them the opportunity to get photo documentation and get all the interviews done at one time. Commissioners discussed if this idea would work.

**** Finalize list of interviewees:**

- * Commissioner Wildgoose asked the Commissioners if they had anyone else to add to the list.
- * Kristen from CSUMB needs the final list by January 2019.

b. Review Historical Designation Project:

- * Commissioner Brown reported that there was a meeting about a survey online to gather historical places in Seaside. They need to check if this has been developed. There is \$5,000.00 allocated for plaques/markers for this project.
- * The next step would be to establish a criteria for events, landmarks and historical significance to Seaside.
- * There was discussion of forming a sub-committee for this project. They plan on doing baby steps and picking out five sites at a time.

c. Update on the Revised Public Art Policy Document:

- * Commissioner Brown received a PDF Public Art Policy document from staff. He converted it into a Word document for editing. He made the recommended edits and cleaned the document up. Commissioner Brown requested for the staff to look at document to make sure it does or does not need any more changes before it is presented to the City Council for approval. Hopefully by the next Art & History Commission meeting they will have a formal review copy to look over.

d. Discuss Recommending a Free Wall for Kids to have a Public Creative Space to Paint:

- * Commissioner Brown suggested that they designate a wall or a side of a building for kids to paint with supervision. It would be a place where kids can hang out, express themselves and show their creativity to the public. This may help decrease the graffiti in Seaside. The Commissioners discussed if it is viable and where it could be. They also discussed different ideas on this subject.

e. Update on Avery Gallery Display Cases:

- * Staff reported that they met with Paul from the glass company to show him what should be changed. The glass will have to be hung differently and replaced with shatterproof glass. The track will also be different. Paul will get back with staff with an estimate of the cost. Commissioners discussed replacing the brown carpet in the cases. They also discussed when this work should be done.

f. Report on Selective Learning Intern Project:

- * Commissioner Silveria reported that CSUMB student Bonnie Dawson has finished her 30 hours and is gone now. She did make a spread sheet of all the tapes and 20 transcripts. The transcripts need to be digitized. The older tapes have transcripts. The Commissioners requested a color printer. Bonnie also did a pie chart of Seaside demographics from 2010, 2000, 1990, 1980, 1970 and 1960.

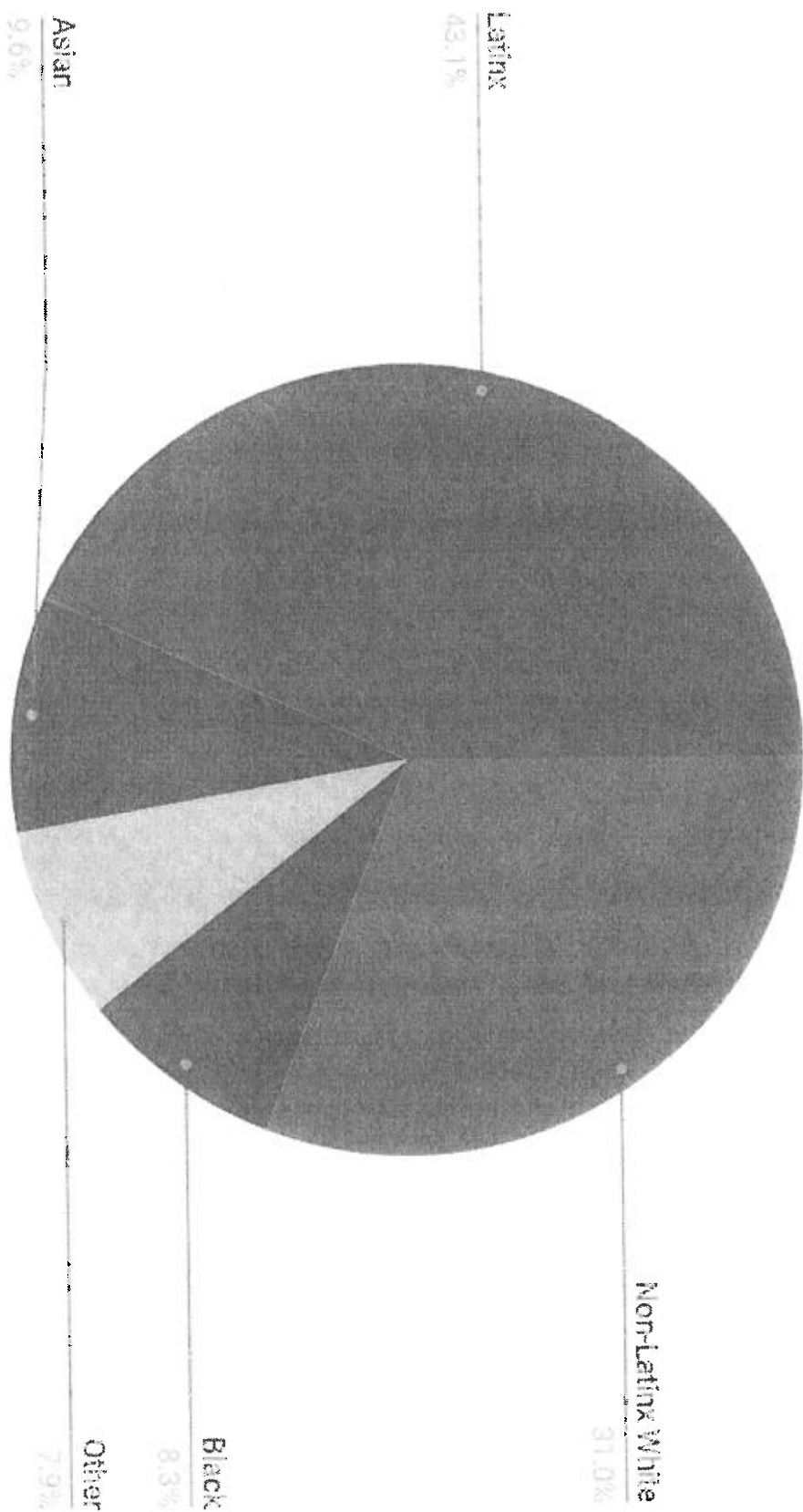

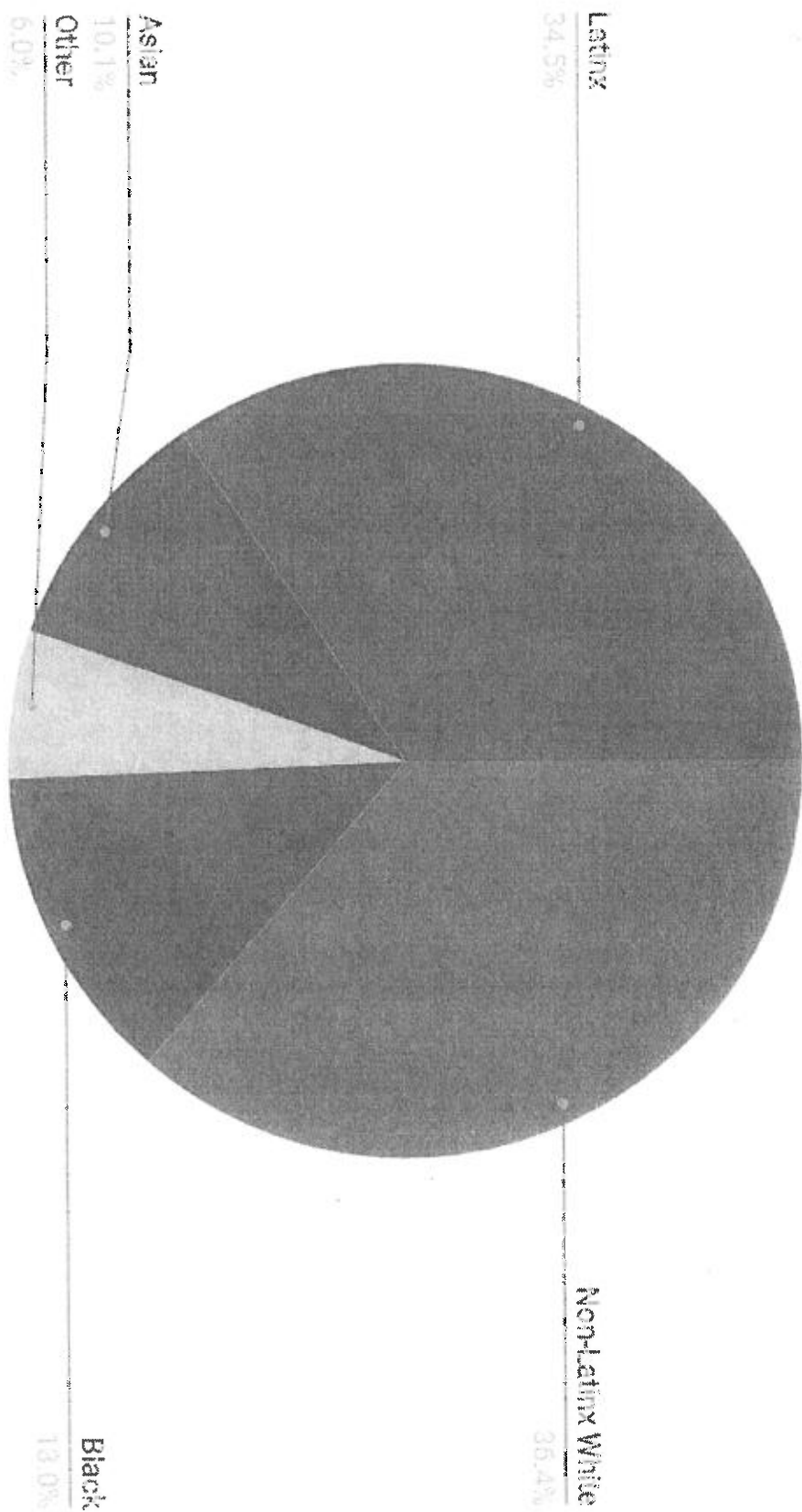

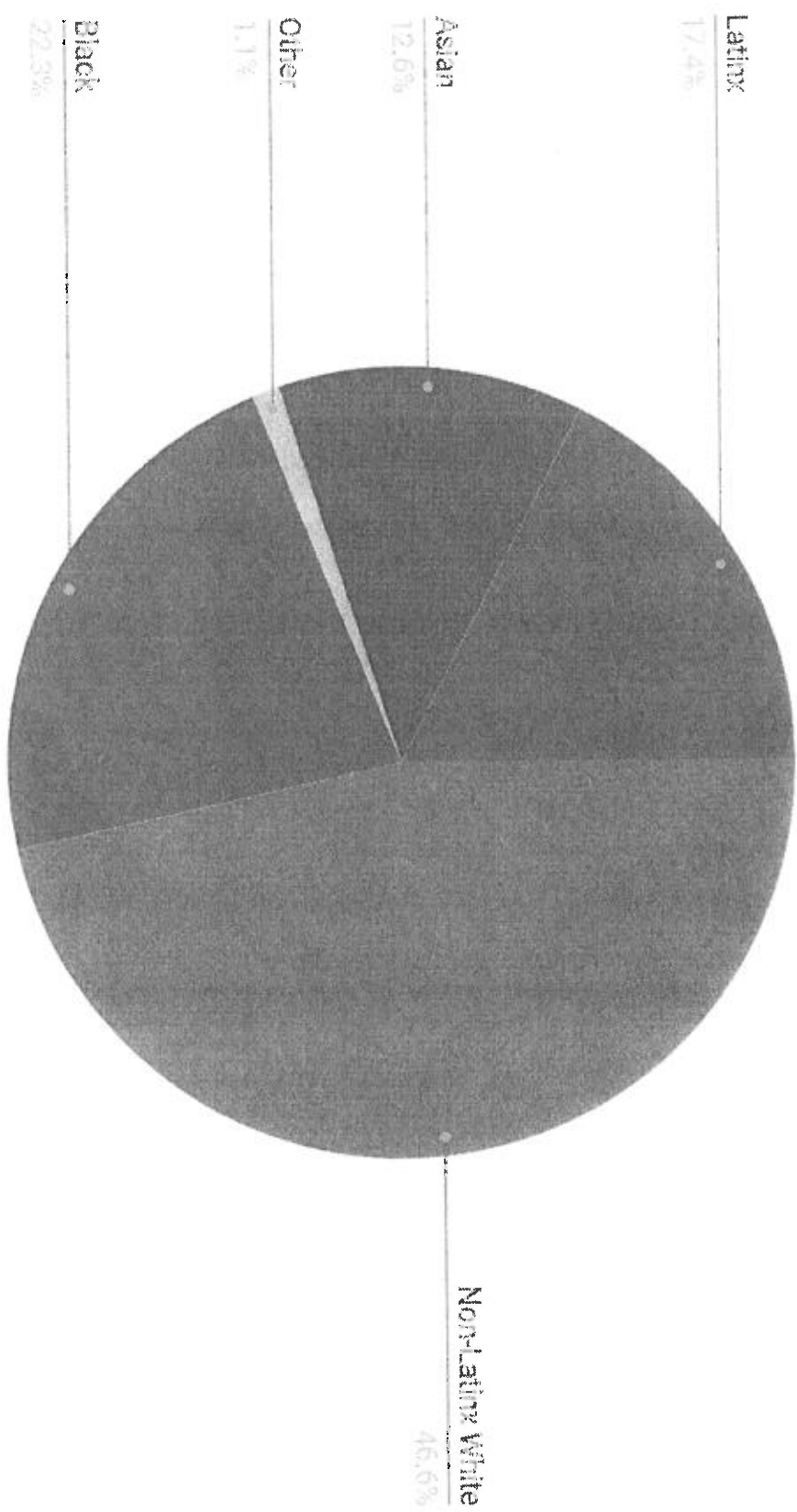
Seaside Demographic 2010



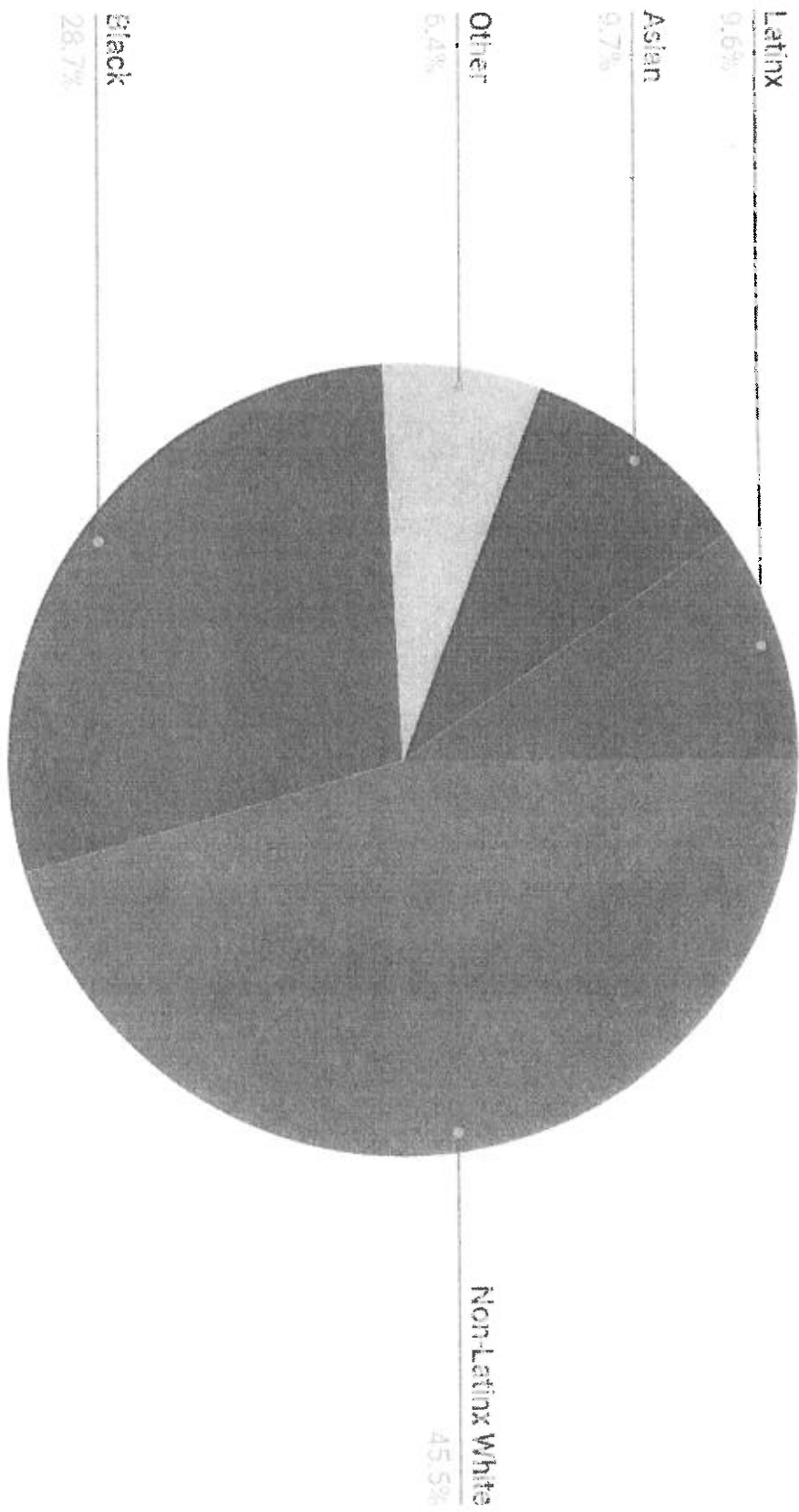
Seaside Demographic 2000



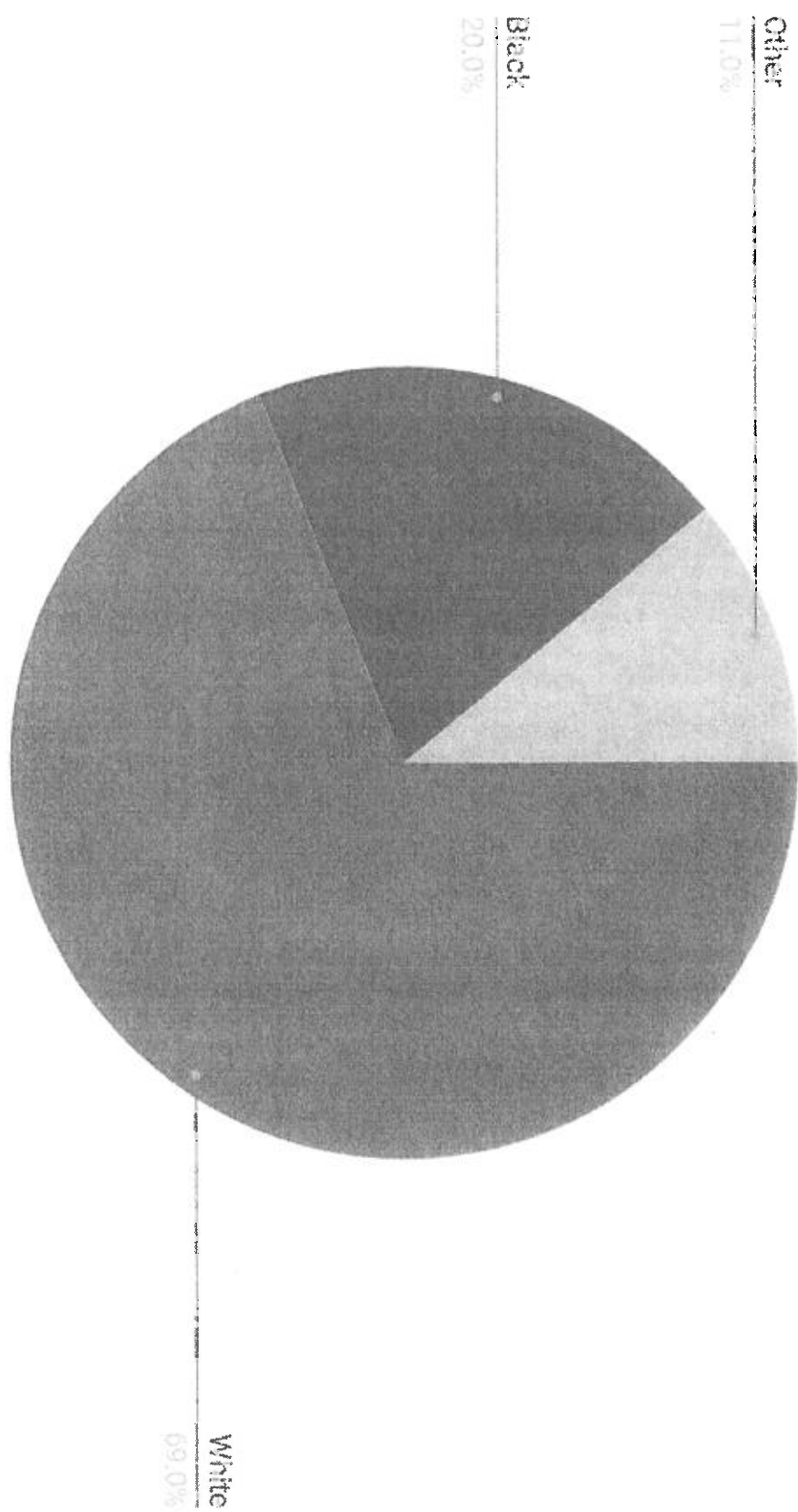
Seaside Demographic 1990



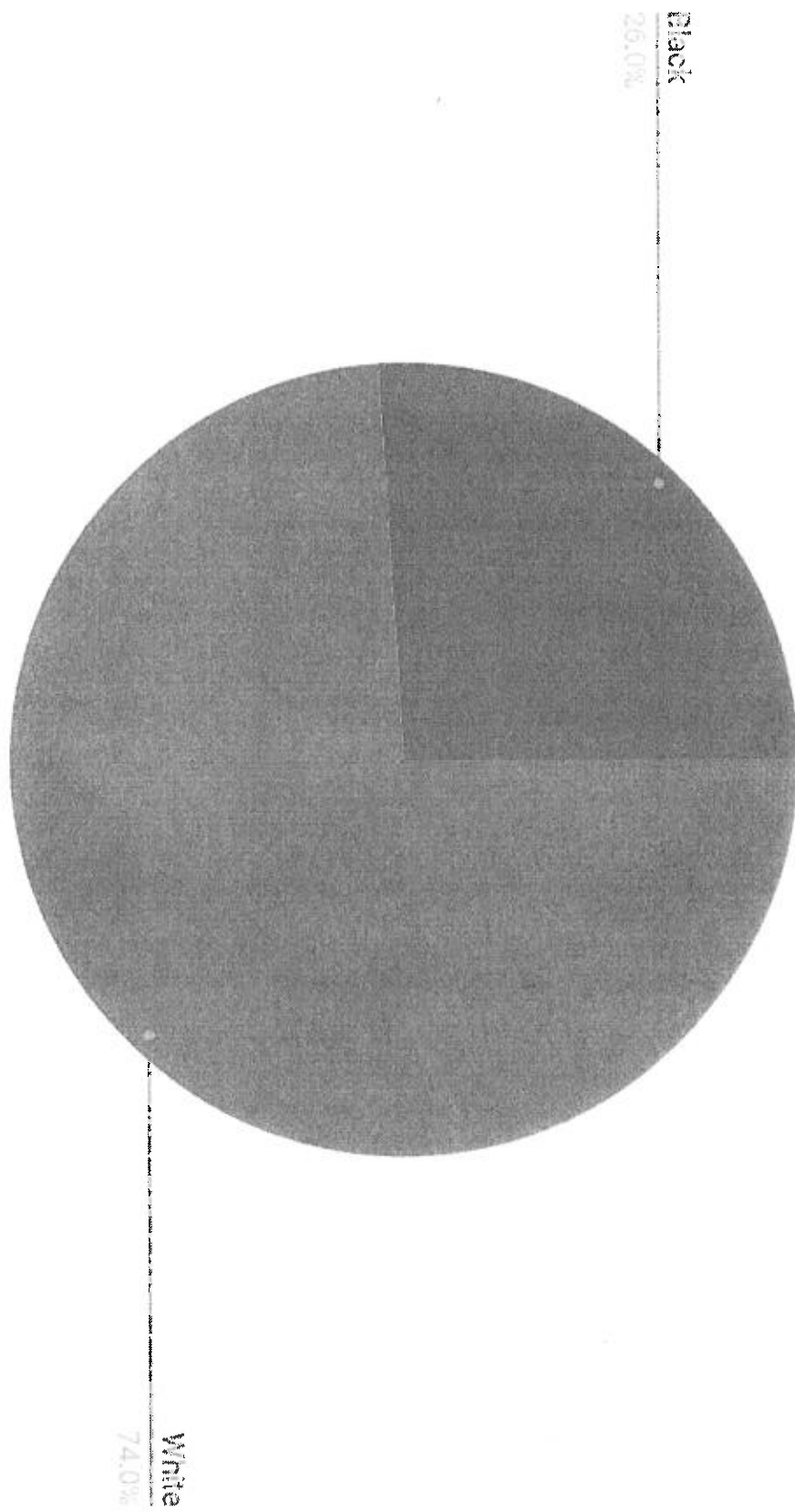
Seaside Demographic 1980

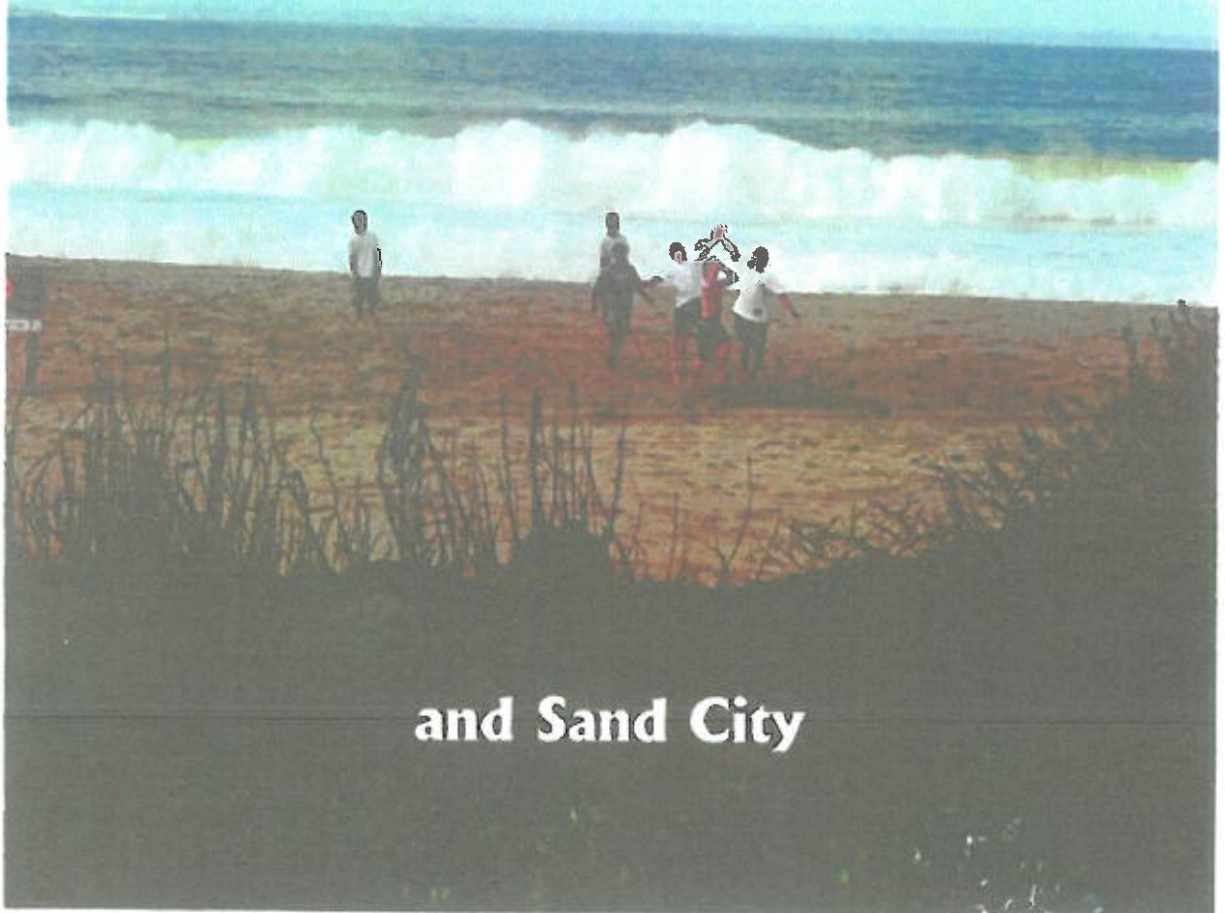

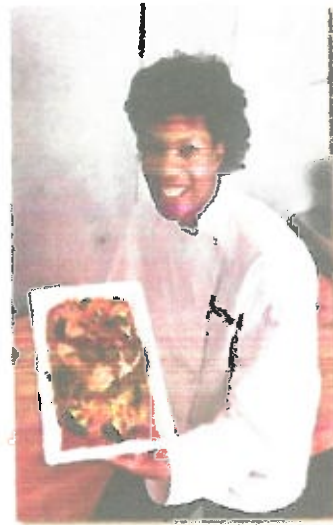
