1. **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Rubio called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

2. **ROLL CALL – ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM**

PRESENT: Alexander, Campbell, Jones, Pacheco, Rubio

ABSENT: None

3. **PUBLIC COMMENT**

There were no public comments.

4. **FIELD TRIP**

City Engineer, Rick Riedl, presented the item, providing a brief presentation and background of the project. Riedl explained the contents of the agenda packets; siting descriptions of the recommended projects and described the compiled map and procedural requirements for the tour. On question, Mr. Riedl provided explanation of Measure X, Measure SB1 and bonding.

Council adjourned to field trip at 4:15 PM.

5. **STUDY SESSION**

A. **STUDY SESSION ON STREETS REPAIR PROJECTS TO BE FINANCED BY MEASURE X AND SB1**

The City Council reconvened the Special Meeting at 5:40 PM.

Mayor Rubio invited comments from the public.

- Mitt Sawhney thanked staff for the tour, stating that the streets need a lot of repair. He inquired if the City had ever considered placing retaining walls every few blocks down the hill as well as prohibiting heavy vehicles on General Jim Moore to maintain the streets.
- Ian Oglesby encouraged the Council ensure storm drains are taken care of and questioned when the next street evaluation will take place.

Mayor Rubio spoke positively about the tour and the proposed street maintenance priorities and requested modification to include the section from San Pablo from Mescal down to Yosemite and the intersection at Ord Grove; citing the square patch between the stop sign. Council Member Pacheco agreed that in general, it is a good plan and understands that we have to protect the streets in fair condition so they don't fail. Pacheco inquired feasibility for CDBG funding to be used to add additional streets, specifically Fremont from Wheeler to Kimball. Council Member Campbell concurred and requested staff to return with a plan for improvements on Kimball. Mr. Campbell also inquired about adding franchise fees from MST if they are causing street damage or other impact fees.

Mayor Rubio pointed out that it is up to the City Council to set the priorities, adding that they have set money aside in the reserves for capital improvements and it is up to the Council how they structure the program. Mr. Riedl spoke to past and future grant funding that has funded street improvements. Mayor Pro Tem Alexander also thanked staff for the tour and stressed that the rating system is important for the public to be aware of and stated he learned a lot about the road conditions.

Mayor Rubio requested staff to return with an overlay of the bus routes and what kind of effect it has on roads and the rating on those streets; also distinguishing which may be eligible for CDBG funding for the next grant cycle.

6. **ADJOURNMENT**

On motion, the meeting was adjourned at 6:05 PM.
