RESULT: Motion Passes 5-0

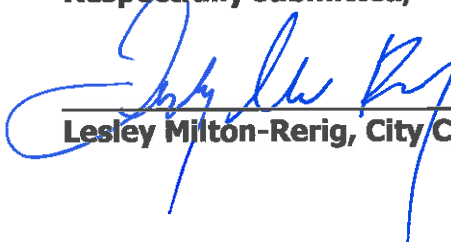

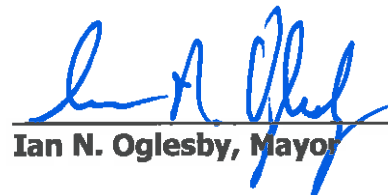
12. ADJOURNMENT
