A. ADOPT A RESOLUTION TO RESERVE LAND IN THE VICINITY OF GENERAL JIM MOORE AND BROADWAY AVENUE FOR POTENTIAL FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER

City Manager Malin spoke of the approved commissioned feasibility Study for a Family Justice Center and that the final report is available and linked to the agenda packet. The purpose of the resolution was to identify support that a family justice center could be approved as part of a new Civic Campus if it is built in the future and that it was necessary for the California Judicial Commission to have a record that they can use for consideration as they evaluate Seaside as a potential site. Further consideration of actual construction will have to go through a full CEQA process. He reiterated this is not a project at this time. Staff affirmed that this is not a project, that the City doesn't control the building of the Courthouse.

On motion by Mayor Pro Tem Dave Pacheco and seconded by Council Member Alissa Kispersky and passed by the following vote the City Council adopted resolution 19-29 supporting a potential family justice center.

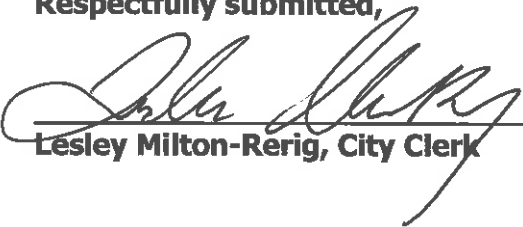
