A. **FOOD PANTRY DISCUSSION LEAD BY COMMITTEE MEMBER MANCINI**

a) Mancini discussed the difference between a Food Bank and a Food Pantry; there are 56 pantries in the area and 5 are located in Seaside. If a homeless individual is unable to cook food, it limits what can be taken from the pantry. Although there is no longer a kitchen in Seaside, believe it would be a good idea to bring one back. Murray: Salvation Army does provide meals, but difficult to get to location. IHLP gives a sack lunch in the morning, Gathering has meals as well.

b.) Public Comment: Mr. Mancini, SAFE Place has meals and overnight stay. SAFE House has kitchen and transitional housing.
