4. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

- * Hector Gonzalez reported that the neighborhood that surrounds the Iglesia Episcopal San Pablo Apostol Church has serious concerns about the noise level during their holiday festivities from December 07, 2019 – December 18, 2019. There is also trash everywhere and a parking issue. This has been a problem for about nine years and in the last four or five years it has been getting worse. Some of the neighbor's houses are about 20 feet from the church building. They have documented and addressed this with City Hall for several years now with no result.

* Hector stated during the holiday festivities the church extends their building by putting up tents all around the back and have outdoor events. The church passed flyers out stating they are having four events from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and one event from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. All sound activity, Folkloric Dance and music will be inside church building. Hector stated that the information on the flyers is not correct. He said that there are people there 24 hours during these events and the music is outside.

* Hector stated that they have talked to the church about the noise and they were told that the people in the neighbor are too sensitive. He also stated the he has talked to the City Manager about this too. The neighborhood is looking for peace and quiet. They want the noise ordinance relooked at. Hector stated they wanted Parks & Recreation to be aware of this and they will go to a City Council Meeting to try and get this resolved.

6. BUSINESS ITEMS:

a. Discussion on Pickleball uses on the Wheeler Street Tennis Courts:

* Constance Constable reported that she represents the present and future Seaside players of pickleball. She stated that pickleball is a healthy, (mostly) outdoor activity played on a badminton-sized court over a 36" net. There are three objectives that they would like to propose to the city of Seaside:

1. Pickleball added to the future plan for Parks and Recreation.
2. Pickleball allowed on a trial basis, with temporary lines on the courts at Wheeler Street.
3. Lines for pickleball courts painted on the tennis courts at Wheeler Street.

* Constance stated that the first and third bulleted items are long-term objectives. Allowing the players to lay down painter's tape to line the courts is a great interim step. The players would remove the painter tape after they were done playing. There was discussion about the currently a sign outside the courts stating "Only Tennis is allowed on Tennis Courts".

* The Commissioners voted and accepted to recommend to the City Council to allow pickleball on all four courts Monday – Sunday with temporary signage and a trial period of six months. Also, allowing players to lay down painter's tape to line the courts and remove the tape after they are done.

b. Discuss and approve Swag items for the Parks & Recreation Commission:

- * The Commissioners discussed which swag items they wanted. They voted and accepted on spending \$500.00 to purchase three swag items; Phone Wallets, Frisbees and Pens. Alicia Louise Gaines-Lynch/James White M/S/P
- * Staff will research the cost of the three swag items and will share the information with the Commissioners at the January 2020 Parks & Recreation Commission meeting.

c. Receive update on current Parks Projects:

- * Staff reported on the following parks projects:
 - ** Capra Park is in design progress. They have a couple more months on that and will continue to update the Commissions.
 - ** Highland Otis Park is in the design process and has about two more months on finishing the design. They do have the money for the construction. They have to confirmed with their engineers before they go to bid.
 - ** Manzanita Stuart Park's phase 1 (the design) is complete. There are no funds available at this time for Phase 2 and the construction cost, however, staff has applied for some grants and will know the results in early 2020 (January or February).
 - ** Ellis Park's design is complete and is ready to go out to bid when they get the funds for the construction. Staff is looking for potential grants for this.
 - ** There is no update on the wheelchair-accessible swing.

8. REPORTS FROM RECREATION STAFF:

- * Staff reported that the City of Seaside Winter Wonderland and Tree Lighting was on Friday, December 13, 2019 at City Hall lawn from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The Mayor and some of the City Council helped pass out free hot chocolate. The weather was good and they had a great turn out. The Community Holiday Luncheon was on Saturday, December 14, 2019 from 11:00 a.m.to 2:00 p.m. They served about 300 people.

9. REPORTS FROM PARKS STAFF:

- * Staff reported that the remaining nine dog waste stations will be installed in the middle of January 2020.

10. REPORTS FROM COMMISSIONERS:

- * Commissioner Neilson reported that she started a CDBG application and needs to be completed by staff. The deadline to submitted this grant application is January 10, 2020. The grant money would be for accessible playground equipment.
- * Commissioner Neilson gave an update on the Regional Parks grant that she requested. She will know more about that grant in January 2020.
- * Commissioner Maxwell reported that he and Commissioner Cadigan worked the Parks & Recreation table at the City of Seaside Winter Wonderland and Tree Lighting on Friday, December 13, 2019. They got some possible leads on new Commissioners for Parks & Recreation.

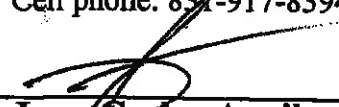

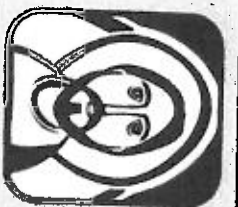

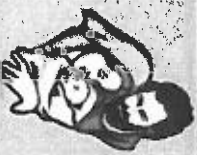

Pickleball is a healthy, (mostly) outdoor activity, played on a badminton-sized court over a 36" net. I represent present and future Seaside players of pickleball, and we have three objectives that we would like to propose to the city of Seaside:

- Pickleball added to the future plan for parks and recreation
- Pickleball allowed on a trial basis, with temporary marks on the courts at Wheeler Street
- Lines for pickleball courts painted on the tennis courts at Wheeler Street.

Allowing pickleball on a trial basis could happen fairly soon. Players could use painter's tape to line the courts, and remove the tape when they are done playing. There is currently a sign outside the courts stating, "Only Tennis is allowed on Tennis Courts." I am not sure how to make the public aware that pickleball would also be allowed on a trial basis, but we could think of something. The first and third bulleted items are long-term objectives. Adding pickleball to future plans, and obtaining permission and funding to have courts painted will take time. Allowing players to lay down painter's tape to mark a court is a great interim step!
