3. VISITORS & GUESTS:

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

* Laura Murphy reported that she is the liaison officer between the Environmental Committee and the Parks & Recreation Commission.

* Laura reported that the Environmental Committee planted Monardella Villosa, Coyote Mint, Solidago Velutina ssp. californica, California Goldenrod, Symphyotrichum Chilense, California Aster, Verbena Lasiochachys and Vervain at Lincoln Cunningham Park, Beta Park and Farallones Park. They will be planting at Capra Park soon.

* Laura encouraged the Commissioners to go and take a look at the plants while they are growing. She stated that if any of the Commissioners would like to steward another site for planting to please let her know.

5. APPROVAL OF December 16, 2019 MINUTES:

6. BUSINESS ITEMS:

a. Welcome New Commissioner:

- * Commissioners welcomed Franco Pacheco. Franco reported that he is from Seaside. He left to go to college at age 17, then went to Grad school and then went into the military. He taught college education and coached for the last decade. He stated that at age 15 he started working at Pattullo Swim Center and Summer Camp programs at the Oldemeyer Center before he left for college. He is happy to be on this Commission.

b. Review and discuss Seaside Municipal Code 9.08 and make recommendations for possible amendment to the Code:

- * Commissioner Cadigan reported that he went over Ego Park at Roberts Lake to Check it out. There was a tent, two bikes with trailers, carts full of stuff, two RV's with trash outside them. There was one homeless person laying halfway in one of the parking spots and one homeless person just roaming around. He took pictures of how it was at Ego Park and Trinity Park to show the Commissioners. Commissioner Cadigan stated that he went to the City Council meeting on February 20, 2020. He spoke during public comment about the homeless issues in the parks in Seaside.
- * The actual ordinance (chapter 9.08 -- Parks and Recreation Areas) and the draft with some changes to the ordinance (that Commissioner Cadigan came up with) were handed out to review. Commissioners Cadigan went over the information in his draft with the Commissioners. The Commissioners are going to take the draft home to review it more and make changes. They will bring it back to the next month Parks & Recreation meeting to come up with a final draft.
- * Commissioner Cadigan handed out his draft cover letter for the Commissioners to review. He suggested that they could discuss the letter more in depth at next month Parks and Recreation meeting. He stated that they can give the cover letter with an information packet to the Homeless Committee with their concerns about the Homeless. Commissioner Cadigan and Commissioner White plan to attend the Homeless Committee meeting on February 27, 2020 at City Hall at 6:30 p.m.

c. Review the 2019-2020 Work Plan and have a preliminary discussion on the 2020-2021 Work Plan:

- * The Commissioners reviewed the work plan and discussed what needs to be changed and added for the 2020-2021 work plan. They discussed the different grants for the parks. Their priority parks are Ellis Park, Manzanita Stuart Park and Capra Park. The Commissioners are going to take the work plan home to review it more and make changes. They will bring it back to the next month Parks & Recreation meeting to come up with a final draft of the work plan.

- * Public Comment – Laura Murphy reported that she did not see anything thing about Urban Forestry in the work plan. She feels urban forestry should be added to the work plan because the parks should have trees. Having urban forestry in Seaside would help with the care and management of single trees and tree populations in urban settings for the purpose of improving the urban environment.

d. Brief update on the Alternative Wheelchair-Accessible equipment:

- * Staff reported that they got quotes from two different companies for the Inclusive Whirl (ADA Merry Go Round) and the Merry Musical.
- * The first quote was from Miracle Play Systems. Their quote was for \$46,371.37 which includes the equipment, installation and rubber surfacing. Their quote is under the \$50,000.00 budget. Miracle Play Systems is easy to work with because they are part of the Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and staff does not have to go to bid.
- * The second quote is from GameTime. Their first quote was for \$38,938.21 which includes the equipment, installation and using wood chips. Their second quote was for \$62,298.16 which includes the equipment, installation and rubber surfacing. GameTime is not part of the Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and staff would have to get three bids.

7. REPORTS FROM RECREATION STAFF:

- * Staff reported that the Senior Valentines Luncheon and Dance is on Thursday, February 13, 2020. Staff stated that they are always looking for volunteers for the Senior Luncheon and Dance if the Commissioners are interested in that. Parents Night Out is on Friday, February 14, 2020 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and it is \$20.00 per child/\$16.00 per each additional sibling. The Third Annual Evening with my Gal is on Friday, February 28, 2020 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Registration for the Spring sessions of swimming will start on Monday, March 02, 2020. The 4th July Event was approved by the City Council. The Easter event is on Saturday, April 11, 2020 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. They are looking into a citywide Census event. Blues in the Park starts on Sunday July 12, 2020. The City Council approval the recommendation for Pickleball at Wheeler Street Tennis Courts (with a few changes) at the February 06, 2020 meeting.

- * Staff reported that Metz Park has a new scoreboard. The installation of the cameras are being finalized at Cutino Park and should be functional soon.

9.08.010 Definitions.

For the purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise apparent from the context, certain words and phrases used in this chapter are defined as follows:

“Caretaker” means the person or persons who are responsible for the care and maintenance of the city park areas or facilities.

“Director” means the director of recreation services.

“In-line skates/roller blades” means a form of skate with nonmetallic skate wheels mounted to the bottom of each boot or shoe, one in front of the other, running down the center of the boot or shoe.

“Other wheeled recreational device” means nonmotorized bicycles, scooters, in-line skates, roller skates, or wheelchairs.

“Park area” or “facility” means any public park, playground, recreational area, recreational facility or building, swimming pool, greenbelt, landscaped area around a public building, or other area in the city owned or used by the city and devoted to active or passive recreation.

“Person” or “applicant” means any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, league or organization of any kind who desires to use or uses any city park area or facility.

“Roller skates” means a form of skate with four nonmetallic wheels affixed to the bottom of each boot or shoe with a wheel situated at the outer four corners of each boot or shoe.

“Scooter” means a vehicle that typically has one front and one rear wheel with a low footboard between, is steered by a handlebar, and is propelled by pushing one foot against the ground while resting the other on the footboard.

“Skate park” and “park” mean the cement surface that is designed and used for skating. The park area includes the bowl.

D. Appeal. An applicant shall have the right to appeal in writing any condition attached to a permit, or the denial of a permit, within five working days after receipt of the determination of the director. The applicant shall appeal to the parks and recreation commission under the standards set forth in subsection B of this section, and thereafter may appeal any adverse decision to the city council.

E. Effects of Permits. A permittee shall be bound by all park rules and regulations and all applicable laws fully as though the same were inserted in such permits.

F. Liability of Permittees. The person or persons to whom a permit is issued shall be liable for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by any person whatsoever by reason of the negligence of the person or persons to whom such permit shall have been issued.

G. Revocation. The director shall have the authority to revoke a permit upon a finding of violation of any rule or law or upon good cause shown.

H. Fees and Deposits. Any fees or deposits required for the use of city personnel, equipment, park areas or facilities shall be submitted with the application for permit. Required fees shall be paid in full by the applicant within thirty days prior to the proposed use or as otherwise specified in the permit. If the fees are not paid within the time allowed for payment, the permit shall be null and void. (Ord. 695 § 1, 1986)

9.08.045 Skateboarding areas.

A. Rules and Regulations. Skate park users in violation of the facility rules and regulations shall be subject to administrative citation pursuant to the Seaside Municipal Code:

1. All skate park users shall wear a helmet, kneepads and elbow pads at all times when using the facility. All safety equipment shall be in good condition and repair and must fit the skater properly.
2. Hours. It is unlawful for any person to use or be present upon the skate park facility at any time other than the approved hours of operation. Signs shall be posted about the skate park facility indicating the hours of operation.
3. In addition to the rules set forth in this section, the director may establish other reasonable rules and regulations to protect the skate park facility or the skate park and the persons using them from injury or damage.
4. Bicycles are not permitted to be used in the skate park.

B. Unsupervised Venue — Assumption of Risk. The city of Seaside skate park is an unsupervised recreational venue. The director shall cause to be posted signs at the skate park, facing the interior and exterior of the skate park, stating, at a minimum:

1. Use of skateboards and other wheeled recreational devices is a hazardous activity.
2. Use of the facility is at the user's own risk.
3. Skate park hours.
4. Helmets, kneepads, and elbow pads are required to be worn while using the designated skate park area.
5. Failure to wear helmets, kneepads, and elbow pads in the designated skate park area will subject persons to citation (SMC 9.08.070). (Ord. 1065 § 4, 2019)

9.08.050 Rules and regulations.

The director may establish rules and regulations as may be necessary for the proper administration and regulation of park areas or facilities. Such rules and regulations shall be approved by the city council, upon

1. Place in any lake or stream, by any means, any substance which will or may result in the pollution of waters;

2. Dispose of any refuse or trash, except in proper receptacles. Where receptacles are not provided, refuse or trash shall be carried away from the park by the person responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere.

F. Model Airplanes, Boats, Crafts. No person using a park shall fly model airplanes or operate model boats or model automobiles or model crafts of any kind or description except in areas set aside for those specific activities or by authorized permit.

G. Swimming. No person using a park shall swim, bathe, or wade in the waters of any lake or stream.

H. Picnic Areas and Use. No person using a park shall:

1. Picnic, lunch or loiter in a place which interferes with the use of active recreation areas. City park caretakers or recreation personnel shall have the authority to regulate the activities in such areas when necessary to prevent congestion and to secure the maximum use for the comfort and convenience of all. Visitors shall comply with any directions given to achieve this end. Individual fireplaces, tables and benches shall be used on the basis of "first-come, first-served" unless reserved by permit.

2. Leave a picnic area before their fire is completely extinguished and before all trash and other refuse is placed in the disposal receptacles where provided.

I. Closing Hours. No person shall use, camp, sleep, remain, occupy, be present, or loiter in any park area or facility between dusk and dawn, except when participating in city-sponsored or city authorized activities or programs.

J. Traffic, Parking, Bicycles. No person using a park shall:

1. Fail to comply with all applicable provisions of the Vehicle Code of the state of California in regard to equipment and operation of vehicles;

2. Leave a bicycle in a place other than a bicycle rack when such is provided and there is a space available;

3. Ride or drive any vehicle on any area except the paved or gravel park roads or parking areas, or such other areas as may on occasion be specifically designated as temporary parking areas by the city;

4. Ride a bicycle on other than a vehicular road or trail designated for that purpose. (Ord. 1065 § 5, 2019; Ord. 1050 § 1, 2018; Ord. 987 § 2, 2010; Ord. 777 § 1, 1990; Ord. 767 § 1, 1989; Ord. 695 § 1, 1986)

9.08.070 Enforcement.

A. The director of recreation services, the chief of police, and their duly authorized employees shall enforce the provisions of this chapter, and shall have the authority to eject from park areas and facilities any person acting in violation of these rules and regulations, and to confiscate any property being used in such a manner so as to endanger persons or property.

B. Administrative Citations, Fines, Parent/Guardian Responsibility and Administrative Hearing.

1. The director, and his/her designee, shall have authority to issue administrative citations and administrative fines in accordance with applicable provisions of Chapter 2.56 SMC and this chapter.

2. The parent or legal guardian having control or custody of an unemancipated minor whose conduct violates this chapter shall be jointly and severally liable with the minor for the amount of any administrative fine imposed pursuant to this section.

3. Administrative citations and fines issued under this section shall be subject to the administrative hearing provisions of Chapter 2.56 SMC. (Ord. 1065 § 6, 2019; Ord. 695 § 1, 1986)

Mobile Version

9.08.010 Definitions.

“City park” shall mean any outdoor area owned or operated by the City and open to the general public for recreational purposes, regardless of any fee or age requirement, including but not limited to: parklands, including portions of parks, such as picnic areas, playgrounds, or sports fields; walking paths; gardens; hiking and nature trails; bike paths; horseback riding trails; athletic fields; and skateboard parks. “City park” shall also include a parking lot or any other area designated or primarily used for parking vehicles of persons accessing the City park. This definition shall not apply to any public street located outside of a City park that is designed and intended for regular motor vehicle travel or designated bicycle lanes located within such street.

9.08.060 Prohibitions generally.

H. Picnic Areas and Use. No person using a park shall:

1. Picnic, lunch or loiter in a place which interferes with the use of active recreation areas. City park caretakers or recreation personnel shall have the authority to regulate the activities in such areas when necessary to prevent congestion and to secure the maximum use for the comfort and convenience of all. Visitors shall comply with any directions given to achieve this end. ~~Individual fireplaces,~~ City owned permanent park BBQ's, tables and benches shall be used on the basis of “first-come, first-served” unless reserved by permit.

- K. Go upon any planter area, lawn or grass plot where prohibited by the Director and which prohibition is indicated by sign, or in the absence of such sign, where it is clear that going upon the planter area, lawn or grass plot will damage such area.
- L. Loiter, lay, sleep, rest, sit, in a manner that blocks or partially blocks any walkway, trail, athletic field, playground equipment, parking space, or any other area designated or primarily used for parking vehicles of persons accessing the City park.
- M. Place objects, articles, bicycles, shopping carts, or personal belongings in a manner that blocks or partially blocks any walkway, trail, athletic field, playground equipment, parking space, or any other area designated or primarily used for parking vehicles of persons accessing the City park.
- O. Indulge in riotous, boisterous, threatening, indecent, or immoral conduct or abusive, threatening, or profane language.
- P. Use of tobacco shall not be permitted within twenty-five feet of playgrounds, skateparks, athletic fields, park trails, walkways, and tot lot sandbox areas, as the terms are defined in California Health and Safety Code Section [104495](#)(a).

“Tobacco or tobacco related product” shall have the following meanings:

1. A product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, or snuff.
2. A product containing, made, or derived from any other weed or plant, including products made with cannabis, that is smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, or snuff. This subsection shall not apply to food products intended for nourishment and sustenance.
3. An electronic device that delivers nicotine, cannabis, or other vaporized liquids to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, pipe, or hookah.

“Use” shall mean lighting, heating, burning, smoking, chewing, ingesting, snorting, sniffing, inhaling, absorbing, dissolving, and vaping.

- Q. Violate any federal, state or local law, rule or regulation;

Many residents and visitors of Seaside do not use our public parks because they fear these spaces are controlled by transients. Often homeless sleep during daylight hours in parks and other public places. Therefore, the park may be laden with individuals sleeping on benches, erecting tents, laying on pathways or in picnic areas during the park's busiest hours. This condition only worsens the conflict with legitimate park users. Negative impacts associated with homeless encampments that included:

- Harm to park visitors
- Damage to businesses near encampments
- Drain on city resources
- Harm to the environment

Because of the positioning of the city and its current un-written policy towards these encampments, homeless sites have a negative impact on the park environment.

Members of homeless encampments oftentimes pay little heed to what is required to properly dispose of trash and garbage. By failing to follow appropriate protocols regarding the disposal of garbage, trash ends up accumulating in a manner that is harmful to the environment.

One of the more significant negative impacts a homeless encampment has on our environment is found in the fact that human waste typically is released into the open. This includes both feces and urine. The release of human waste in this manner contaminates the ground and water and natural bodies of water like rivers, streams, lakes, and ponds. It also exposes residents of encampments and other members of the public to hazardous materials. In addition, other biological materials tend to be released at these encampments. These include:

- Blood
- Vomit
- Contaminated needles
- Other bodily fluids

Homeless encampments cause extensive damage to wilderness areas and parks. These encampments destroy vegetation. The actions of the homeless result in contamination of the areas in which they occupy. This includes causing significant damage to wilderness areas and parks. In some instances, the level of damage to these areas can take a considerable amount of time to remediate. Depending on the nature of the damage to wilderness areas and parks, restoration can take many years.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Seaside Recreation and Parks Commission is to promote and advocate for parks and recreation services in an advisory capacity, to advance and preserve parks and recreation services, and to ensure safe parks and recreation facilities are available for all residents and visitors to the City of Seaside.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The City of Seaside Recreation and Park Commission consists of seven appointed members who hold office for three years. The Commission was established by Ordinance No. 1 on October 13, 1954. At that time SECTION 1-218 authorized the creation of three special committees of three members each; Recreation and Parks Committee, Public Works Committee and Financial Committee. Since then the committee structure was replaced by a Commission structure. Currently the duties of the Recreation and Park Commission are:

1. To act in an advisory capacity to the city council, director of the Recreation Department and the boards of trustees of the school districts and to cooperate with other governmental agencies and civic groups in the advancement of sound park and recreation planning and programming.
2. Recommend policies on recreational services and facilities to the director of community services and the city council;
3. Consult with the Recreation Director on matters relating to the administration and development of recreation areas, facilities, programs and improvements.
4. Make periodic inventories of recreation services that exist or may be needed and interpret the needs of the public to the city council, the school boards of trustees and to the director of the Recreation Department.
5. Aid in coordinating recreation services with the programs of other public agencies and voluntary organizations.
6. Advise the director of community services in the preparation of the annual budget and a long-range recreation capital improvement program.

7. Advise the Recreation Director in the preparation of the annual budget and a long-range recreation capital improvement program.
8. Advise the city council on matters regarding trees, urban forestation endeavors and related resources.
9. Develop, keep current, and aid in the facilitation of a plan for the development, conservation and care of urban forest resources.
10. Develop and review annually a long-range plan for urban forestation.
11. Review, in cooperation with the city forester, annual plans for urban forestry programs.
12. Coordinate or conduct planned projects for the advancement of the urban forest.
13. In collaboration with the city forester, inform residents regarding tree planning, tree care, and forestry programs.

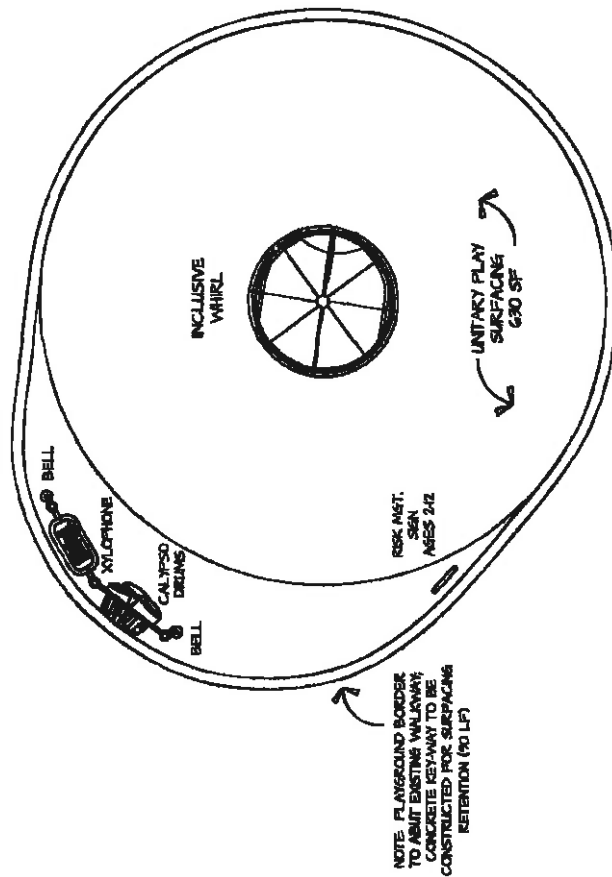

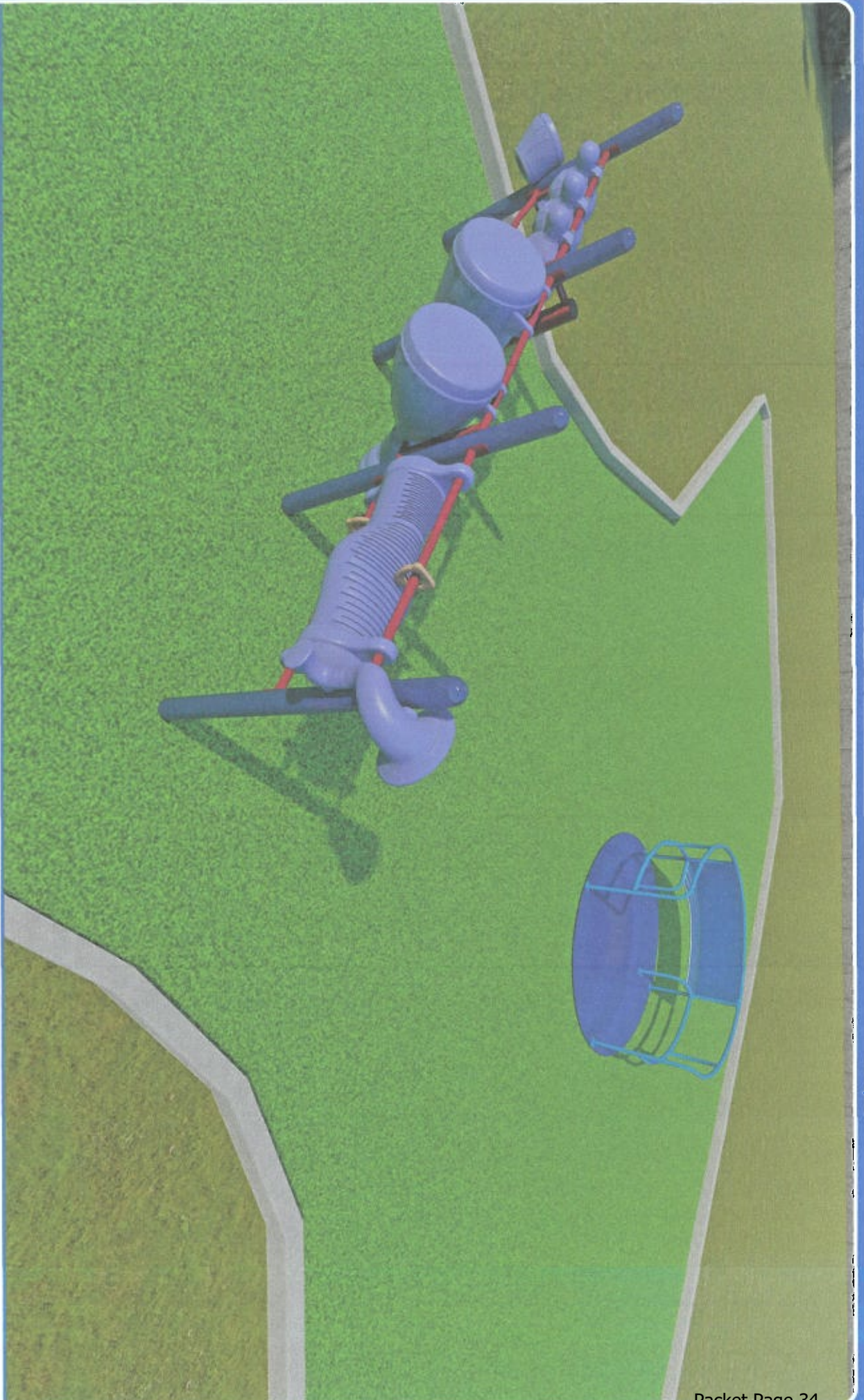
