9. PUBLIC HEARING

A. ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SEASIDE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 13, CHAPTER 10.080 MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM – PERMITS TO CONNECT, PARAGRAPH G, AND TITLE 13, SECTION 12 CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM (SECOND READING - ROLL CALL VOTE)

On motion by Councilmember Campbell and second by Mayor Pro Tem Pacheco and carried by the following roll call vote, the City Council moved to adopt the second reading of the draft ordinance amending Municipal Code Chapters 13.10.080 and 13.12 on the Cross Connection Control Program.

EXTENSION OF CITY-INITIATED URGENCY ORDINANCE No. 1072 ADDING CHAPTER 17.55 TO THE TO THE SEASIDE MUNICIPAL CODE (SMC) AS NEW CHAPTER TO INCLUDE SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES, AND MAKING THEM SUBJECT TO A PERMIT AS SPECIFIED IN A NEW CITY COUNCIL POLICY (ROLL CALL VOTE 4/5 VOTE REQUIRED).

On motion by Councilmember Wizard and second by Councilmember Kispersky and carried by the following roll call vote, the City Council moved to adopt the ordinance, extending Urgency Ordinance No. 1072 which has added Chapter 17.55 to the Seaside Municipal Code to include special provisions for small wireless facilities, and making them subject to a permit as specified therein for the duration of the Urgency Ordinance.

tobacco retailer licensing as presented.

10. BUSINESS ITEMS

A. REPORT ON CURRENT SEASIDE MUNICIPAL CODE 6.04.170 (VICIOUS DOGS) AND CONTEMPLATED FUTURE REVISIONS

Chief Abdul Pridgen provided a presentation on the item that defined potentially dangerous and vicious dogs and the proposed ordinance changes; also responded to questions and comments from the Council.

PUBLIC COMMENT SPEAKERS: Franco Pacheco, Yena Rosa, Jennifer Levy, Peter Kaiser, Mark Severs, SNIP representative

Pacheco - Improve the ordinance to maximize opportunities to ensure that vicious dog attacks are prevented and increase the protection of the residents and their pets.

Kispersky - that the public be notified of the location or proximity of dangerous dogs (posting of dangerous dog on site, victims be provided the proximity of where attacks occurred and/or where the dog resides, least amount of fees for the accuser,

Wizard - mandatory restitution provision (for damages caused by dogs to people or their pets/property); better flesh out the trespassing piece of the ordinance; in favor of a local administrative hearing with an appeal to the court

Campbell - supports mandatory restitution provision; spay/nueter requirement and/or obligation should be incorporated into the ordinance or a required insurance that should be provided to the City, remove trespassing portion, update rules regarding SPCA rabies provisions, administrative hearing process about the animal - a hearing officer should be appointed by an outside agency, in favor of a local administrative hearing (same as Wizard),

Oglesby - supports the position of the State law and the courts process

City Attorney Damon indicated that she would review the concerns raised by the Council.

11. MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, CITY MANAGER AND CITY ATTORNEY COMMENTS AND REPORTS ON COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS

Council Member Campbell requested a study session on the plastics policy that has been developed by the environmental committee.

**A. REPORT ON BASE REDEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION
COMMUNITY BEST PRACTICES TOUR**

City Manager Malin provided a presentation on the Base Redevelopment and Conservation community best practices tour. Another tour will be on January 29 and 30. Councilmember Kispersky and Campbell provided comments on their experience of the tour.

Mayor Oglesby also expressed his support for the tour and thanked the City Manager and Councilmembers for their participation.

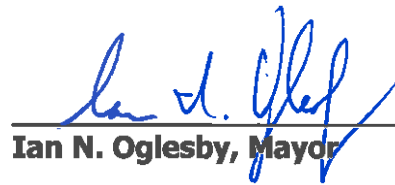
12. ADJOURNMENT
